


Tommy's Arrive in Walbottle

Update from the Association Chair

I hope everyone is well and keeping warm and we hope to see you at our Christmas Event on Saturday, 14 December. The Association Officers wish everyone a very Merry Christmas and a healthy and prosperous New Year.

We held our AGM in September which was well attended, as was our November meeting which is amazing. 24 people attended the November meeting which I think is a record. Thank you to everybody who took the time to attend and give us their views on the village and priorities. In particular I would like to thank Helen Dawson for tireless work as Association Secretary. Helen stood down at the AGM and Nick Strong has kindly taken on this role.

Just after the AGM it was pointed out that the association had not been following the published constitution. This was discussed in detail at the November meeting. Fortunately we have been offered assistance by a member who is familiar with these matters to ensure the constitution is fit for purpose.

There has also been some debate about the role of the WVTRA Facebook page and its ownership. This was discussed at the AGM where it was agreed we should consult widely on a name change. But due to a misunderstanding the name was changed, without further consultation, to "Walbottle Matters". As chair I apologise for this error.

It transpired that we could not change the page name back for 20 days, due to Meta's rules. This matter has been further compounded as the site now has no administrators. We hope to resolve this as soon as possible.

After much debate it was decided at November's meeting that the WVTRA should set up a 'closed' Facebook page which would be used to communicate only the 'official' association business. We will update everyone when this is up and running.

Nevertheless it was agreed that the Walbottle Matters page does have great value and we have a volunteer who has offered to moderate this page when we can claim back administrator rights from Meta.

Home Insurance Increase

Residents might be interested to know that when I set about renewing my house insurance recently I discovered that the premium had gone up considerably. When I questioned this with the broker it was because my address was now considered a "significant flood risk".

As most residents are aware the dene flooded about 10 years ago due to the collapse of a culvert under Millfield Road. However Walbottle is uphill from the dene and we all know that water does not flow uphill.

The flood component was 25% of the total quote. Given the near impossibility of Walbottle flooding I had this element removed, a considerable saving.

Hedgehog Care & Recent Misinformation

ARTICLE BY 'HOPE FOR HEDGEHOGS'

Hedgehogs are nocturnal, they sleep during the day. Some hibernate throughout winter (but not all). This is usually November to mid-March but depends on temperatures. They can sometimes be seen out during the winter, which is why support feeding all year round is so important.

Hogs which weigh under the recommended amount (currently 450g, but constantly under review) simply do not have the fat reserves to survive the cold weather and will quite literally starve to death during their hibernation. Please contact your nearest rescue to arrange for it to be overwintered (do not attempt this at home).

Also, any sized hedgehog out during the day, is not okay - it is already dying (with exception of a feeding mother). Please pick it up and contact your nearest rescue as soon as possible as time is of the essence and can be a matter of life or death.

Wearing gloves, gently scoop up the hedgehog. Place in a high sided cardboard box with a sheet of kitchen roll on the bottom and lay a towel over the top of the hedgehog so it feels safe and can hide. Place somewhere warm, safe and quiet and call **Hope for Hedgehogs in Ryton** on **07443 369 602** to arrange getting it to us asap.

You can help these vulnerable to extinction creatures by support feeding all year round, providing a shelter



like a sturdy, well-made, waterproof hedgehog house, and providing a hedgehog highway so they can roam freely by cutting a small hole in your fence (if there are no gaps), removng a brick from the bottom of a wall, or digging a channel underneath your wall, fence or gate.

Please encourage family, friends and neighbours to do the same.

What to feed hedgehogs:

- Kitten biscuits: particularly chicken kitten biscuits.
- Wet food: cat/dog meat (no fish or gravy).
- ✓ Mushrooms: as a treat.
- ✓ Roast chicken: as a treat.
- ✓ Bowl of fresh water.

Don't feed hedgehogs:

- X Milk/milk-based products: Hedgehogs are lactose intolerant after weaning, the resulting diarrhea can kill them.
- X Bread/cake/biscuits: no nutritional content and hog can fill up on them and so stop seeking nutritional food.
- X Mealworms/peanuts/sunflower seeds: high in phosphorus and low in calcium. Their body will try to balance out both and take calcium from the teeth and bones causing metabolic bone disease.

Hedgehog Misinformation On Social Media

There has been a recent post on social media about hedgehogs lying down in open areas to hibernate. There was also a lot of misinformation in that post.

It has since been edited but had already been shared tens of thousands of times and is still being shared.

Hedgehogs **do not** hibernate visibly outside. If you see a hedgehog lying in the open this hedgehog needs help. Please do not leave small hogs expecting the mother to return, she won't. Hope for Hedgehogs is a charity based in Ryton. They do not allow public viewings of these beautiful wild animals, but we are open daily for admissions (by appointment) and donations.

Any updates will be posted on the website, the Facebook and WhatsApp groups.


